Coming in spring: New injury form

It may be called a "paperless" system, but it will mean some new paper for our policyholders – a newly designed Notice of Injury form.

The State Insurance Fund's "imaging project" continues on track, and we still expect to implement our new document management and workflow system this spring.

The goal of the project is to automate the majority of the workflow process and provide a reliable method for storing and retrieving claims documentation. A key element of document management involves optical character recognition technology. In other words, a paper form is scanned by a machine and information on the form is recognized and stored in a computer. That reduces the need to do manual inputting and should speed up the claims process.

With the new system, policyholders will not have to send the Notice of Injury form to the Industrial Commission. They will only need to send the form to the Fund. Information from that form will be electronically forwarded from the Fund to the Industrial Commission.

The project will require a new Notice of Injury form that is designed specifically for scanning. After the new form is developed and before we switch to our new document management system, we will mail out the new form and claim filing instructions to our policyholders. If you file via e-mail, you will receive a new electronic form via e-mail. The Notice of Injury form also will be available on our Web site.

Policyholder should continue using the forms they have and continue to file Notices of Injury as they do currently until they receive the new version.

Fund issues \$32.4 million dividend

The State Insurance Fund distributed a dividend of approximately \$32.4 million in early January to nearly 24,000 eligible businesses and public agencies.

The dividend was based on premiums paid and losses incurred for those policies with inception dates between July 1, 1998, and June 30, 1999.

To be eligible to receive a dividend, a policyholder must have been insured for six months and have had a policy effective date between July 1, 1998, and June 30, 1999. The dividend amount received by a policyholder was based on the policyholder's premium size and loss experience.

The Fund has paid a dividend to policyholders every year since 1969.

Overall rate up; Fund deviates 15%

Idaho saw an overall increase in workers compensation rates of 6.3 percent effective at the beginning of 2001, the first increase Idaho employers have seen since 1994, when rates went up an average of 0.2 percent.

However, the State Insurance Fund has gained approval for a 15 percent rate deviation, or across-the-board cut, from the standard rates approved for 2001. Last year, the Fund's rates were deviated 13 percent.

According to the Department of Insurance, even with the 2001 rate increase, overall workers compensation rates in Idaho remain 24 percent lower than they were in 1994.

The 2001 rates were proposed by the National Council on Compensation Insurance and approved by the Department of Insurance. The NCCI is a rating organization whose membership consists of workers compensation insurers.

In documents filed with the Department of Insurance, NCCI noted that the Idaho workers compensation system remains stable and functions efficiently, but cited increases in medical severity costs and Idaho Special Indemnity Fund assessments as factors contributing to the need for a rate increase.

Policyholders should not expect, however, to see their rates go up exactly 6.3 percent. Rates are set for approximately 600 classification codes for various types of employments. The 6.3 percent figure is an overall average increase. Some policyholders' rates may increase more than the average, while other policyholders may see their rates decline. The actual premium cost for individual policyholders also is affected by claims experience.

A policyholder's new rates go into effect at the time of policy renewal. A list of the 2001 rates are inside this newsletter.

Fund still offers drug-free workplace credit

The State Insurance Fund continues to offer a 5 percent premium credit for policyholders with a qualifying drug-free workplace program. The credit is applied at audit.

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Lockout/tagout: Preventing machine surprises

When it is time for maintenance, repairs, or machine set up, simply unplugging the machine being worked on is not enough. Many serious accidents happen when someone thought a machine was safely "off". "Lockout/Tagout" is a way to protect yourself and others.

Lockout/tagout ensures that machines and electricity remain temporarily "off". Without a lockout/tagout system, there is the possibility that a machine will suddenly start up. Then someone could be cut, hit, or crushed. There is a serious danger of electrocution or release of hazardous chemicals.

To prevent start-ups, you need to identify a machine's power source: electricity, stored electricity (such as a capacitor), stored pressure (such as compressed air), or stored mechanical energy (such as a coiled spring).

Take 7 steps for lockout/tagout

1. Think, plan and check. If you are in charge, think through the entire procedure. Identify all parts of any systems that need to be shut down. Determine what switches, equipment, and people will be involved. Carefully plan how restarting will take place.

2. Communicate. Let all those who need to know that a lockout/tagout procedure is taking place.

3. Identify all appropriate power sources, whether near or far from the job site. Include electrical circuits, hydraulic and pneumatic systems, spring energy, and gravity systems.

4. Neutralize all appropriate power at the source. Disconnect electricity. Block movable parts. Release or block spring energy. Drain or bleed hydraulic and pneumatic lines. Lower suspended parts to rest positions.

5. Lockout all power sources. Each worker should have a personal lock, labeled with his or her name and department. You may also use clips, chains and lockout boxes.

6. Tagout all power sources and machines. Tags should explain the reason for the lockout, your name, how to reach you, and the date and time of tagging. Tag machine controls, pressure lines, starter switches, and suspended parts.

7. Do a complete test. Double-check all steps above. Do a personal check. Push start buttons, test circuits, and operate valves to test the system.

After the job is completed, follow the safety procedures you set up for restart. With all workers safe and equipment ready, then it's time to turn on the power.
